Barry Martin receives Georgia Farmer of the Year award

Comulgee EMC Board President Barry H. Martin has been named the Georgia 2012 Swisher Sweets/ Sunbelt Expo Southeastern Farmer of the Year. He will now compete against winners from nine other states to be the overall farmer of the year for the Southeast. This winner will be announced at the Sunbelt Expo on Oct. 16, 2012.

An independent farmer for 40 years, Martin has also served on the Ocmulgee EMC Board of Directors since 1972 and has been president since 1982. Martin's strong, conservative leadership has helped Ocmulgee EMC grow and prosper during the financially good times and survive during stormy, difficult times.

As a true Southern gentleman who grew up on his family's farm, Martin credits his mother for helping him get started farming by assisting in the purchase of equipment and credits his lovely wife, Alice, for helping provide income as a schoolteacher during the lean years of his early farming career. Martin and his wife have three grown children and six beautiful grandchildren. Their son, Marc, is an assistant vice presi-

dent at the Bank of Perry, and daughter Monica followed in her mother's footsteps by teaching at Pulaski Elementary. Daughter Mitzi is a registered nurse at a dialysis center in Hawkinsville.

Martin farms about 800 acres with the help of two friends who work part time, primarily during planting and harvesting time. He tends about 600 acres of his own land and rents another 200 acres, growing cotton, peanuts, corn, wheat and sorghum. Martin's farm is very near the Ocmulgee River, and the sandy soil led him, in 1996, to start implementing more effective soil conservation practices.

In the spirit of true cooperation, Martin and his friend, UGA Pulaski County Extension Agent Ronnie Barrentine, have been working together for 17 years to build the model of soil conservation-no till farming that has gained Martin local, state and potentially national recognition. Martin uses equipment he has modified, and some he has designed and built, to be able to use cover crops like rye and crimson clover to protect and enrich the soil that has fed his family for three generations.

Ocmulgee EMC Manager W.H. Peacock says, "You can definitely see the parallels in Mr. Barry's leadership in the board room and what he does on his farm. He thinks progressively to stay modern, efficient and effective, while making sure every procedure and program improves the bottom line."

The team at Ocmulgee EMC offers their sincere congratulations to Martin for winning the Georgia award and best wishes in the Southeast contest.

On tour with tomorrow's leaders

The 2012 Washington Youth Tour



The trip lasted a week, but its impact will endure a lifetime. When 105 high school students, representing 38 Georgia electric membership cooperatives (EMCs), embarked on the 2012 Washington Youth Tour (WYT) June 14-21, not only did they join 1,500 other young leaders from 44 states, but they also became part of a tradition spanning nearly 50 years.

After kicking off the week with a tour of FDR's Little White House in Warm Springs, delegates flew to the nation's capital, where they visited sites such as the new Martin Luther King Jr. National Memorial, Mount Vernon, Smithsonian museums, Supreme Court and the Newseum. Other landmarks such as the Jefferson, Lincoln, FDR, World War II, Korean War and Vietnam Veterans memorials helped them connect with struggles from our country's past, as well as leaders who shaped history.

Delegates recount being moved by tours of the Holocaust Memorial Museum and Arlington National Cemetery. They enjoyed once-in-a-lifetime experiences—like participating in a wreath-laying at the Tomb of the Unknowns and a cruise on the Potomac River with delegates from around the country.

But the WYT isn't just an all-expenses-paid sightseeing tour. Delegates picked up leadership lessons along the way, and they had the opportunity to meet U.S. Sens. Saxby Chambliss and Johnny Isakson and six U.S. House members from Georgia. By all accounts, the experience expanded delegates' horizons. For some, this may be the first time they traveled out of state or flew on an airplane. If the testimony of past delegates is any indication, the students formed friendships that will endure for years to come.
